★ WICKED PROBLEMS are large-scale problems that are resistant to singular solutions – that is, they are problems that are multi-causal (may have multiple causes) and multidimensional. They are challenging to solve precisely because they are systemic and intertwined with other problems. Wicked problems push the boundaries of disciplinary understanding and call for cross-disciplinary collaborations: the integration of diverse perspectives and multifaceted solutions. The arts and humanities are fluent in dealing with such complexities with methods and practices that center deep observation, listening, empathy and imaginative possibilities – modes that are essential to ethical decision-making and knowledge equity.

**** CREATIVE CLUSTERS** are a network for people working in the development of creative programs or projects. The network is interested in regeneration and/or development of projects that deliver outcomes in both cultural and educational terms.

Within this group you find people with which to collaborate, that will provide support for your program, to support you. Keep this within sight.
