Euri Carr is the Performing Arts Program Manager for the Alabama State Council on the Arts. Carr administers grants in dance, music, and theatre and works with performing artists and arts organizations throughout the state.

She taught theatre arts for 11 years in Montgomery Public Schools and directed play productions for the 21st. Century Program for Elmore County School District. Outside of the classroom, Carr facilitated relevant training for the arts, served as a department chair, and worked collaboratively to develop effective classroom learning strategies. She has won numerous teaching awards and participated in the Juilliard School's Evening Division Director's Workshop and the Broadway Teachers Workshop professional development intensive.

Carr serves on the Leadership Team for Amp Up Arts and as an ex-officio member of the Alabama Dance Council.

As a graduate of Alabama State University, Carr obtained her Bachelor of Science and Master of Education in English Language Arts Education, studied abroad at the University of Stirling (Scotland), and is currently pursuing a doctoral degree with a dissertation focus on arts education and student development.
