Libby Jordan serves as Director of Arts & Museums for the City of Florence. She oversees the operations of the four city owned museums including the Kennedy-Douglass Center for the Arts, Pope's Tavern, Florence Indian Mound & Museum, and the Frank Lloyd Wright designed Rosenbaum House.

Prior to working for the City of Florence, Libby worked as Director of Cultural Tourism for Florence-Lauderdale Tourism where she marketed and promoted museums, cultural, and heritage events

Libby is heavily involved in local issues, serving as chairman of various non-profit boards and civic organizations. She served as project manager representative for construction of the Florence-Lauderdale Public Library, the Florence-Lauderdale Tourism building, and the Florence Indian Mound Museum. She also spearheaded a successful \$2,000,000 fundraising campaign for the library foundation. In 2008, she was appointed by Governor Bob Riley to the Board of Trustees of the University of North Alabama, a position she held for 12 years. Her passion is the improvement and promotion of museums, historic preservation, and promoting cultural awareness. She lives and works in historic downtown Florence.
