Sean J. Stevens currently serves as the Program Coordinator of Instructional Services for the Alabama State Department of Education where he is responsible for leading the frameworks, systems, and supports that are needed by Alabama schools to provide standards-driven instructional innovation that is both evidence-based and centered around the student learner as a whole. Sean and his team also lead professional school counselors and school library media specialists from all grade-levels in developing and implementing their respective exemplary instructional support programs at each of Alabama's public schools. In addition, Sean leads the implementation of Alabama's Multi-Tiered System of Support (AL-MTSS) framework and serves as the key state contact for CASEL's Collaborating States Initiative.

Prior to being appointed to this position, Sean served as a professional school counselor, advanced placement coordinator, and business/marketing education instructor at Sylacauga High School for 16 years. During his career, he was awarded Sylacauga City Schools Teacher of the Year and the Alabama Business Education Association Secondary Educator of the Year Award.

Sean is a graduate of the University of West Alabama, where he earned a M.Ed. in School Counseling, and was honored as UWA's College of Education Distinguished Alumni in 2018. In addition, Sean is a graduate of Auburn University, where he earned a B.S. and M.Ed. in Business/Marketing Education.
